LUDLOW SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

April 3, 2020

Mayor Josh Boone called the virtual meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following council members were present: Steve Chapman, Tiffany Grider, Bill Whiteley, Chris Wright, and Julie Terry Navarre.

Mayor Boone advised that he recently signed an executive order agreeing to work with the Kenton County Emergency Management Agency during the COVID-19 global pandemic. Mayor Boone requested that Council approve an emergency ordinance to impose stricter guidelines and a stricter curfew for minors during the state of emergency.

Chief Smith advised that the City needs to stay ahead of the problem with minors running around the city unsupervised. The ordinance has an exception for minors who are going to and from work or accompanied by a parent or guardian. Mayor Boone discussed the importance of social distancing and advised that the parks and the train viewing platform are closed to discourage people from gathering.

Governor Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency and this ordinance will expire when the state of emergency expires.

Mr. McMurtry completed the emergency reading of Ordinance 2020-3 An Emergency Ordinance of the City of Ludlow, in Kenton County, Kentucky, Imposing a Curfew for Minors. Motion by Mr. Wright, second by Mr. Chapman, to adopt Ordinance 2020-3. Following a voice vote, motion carried: all ayes.
