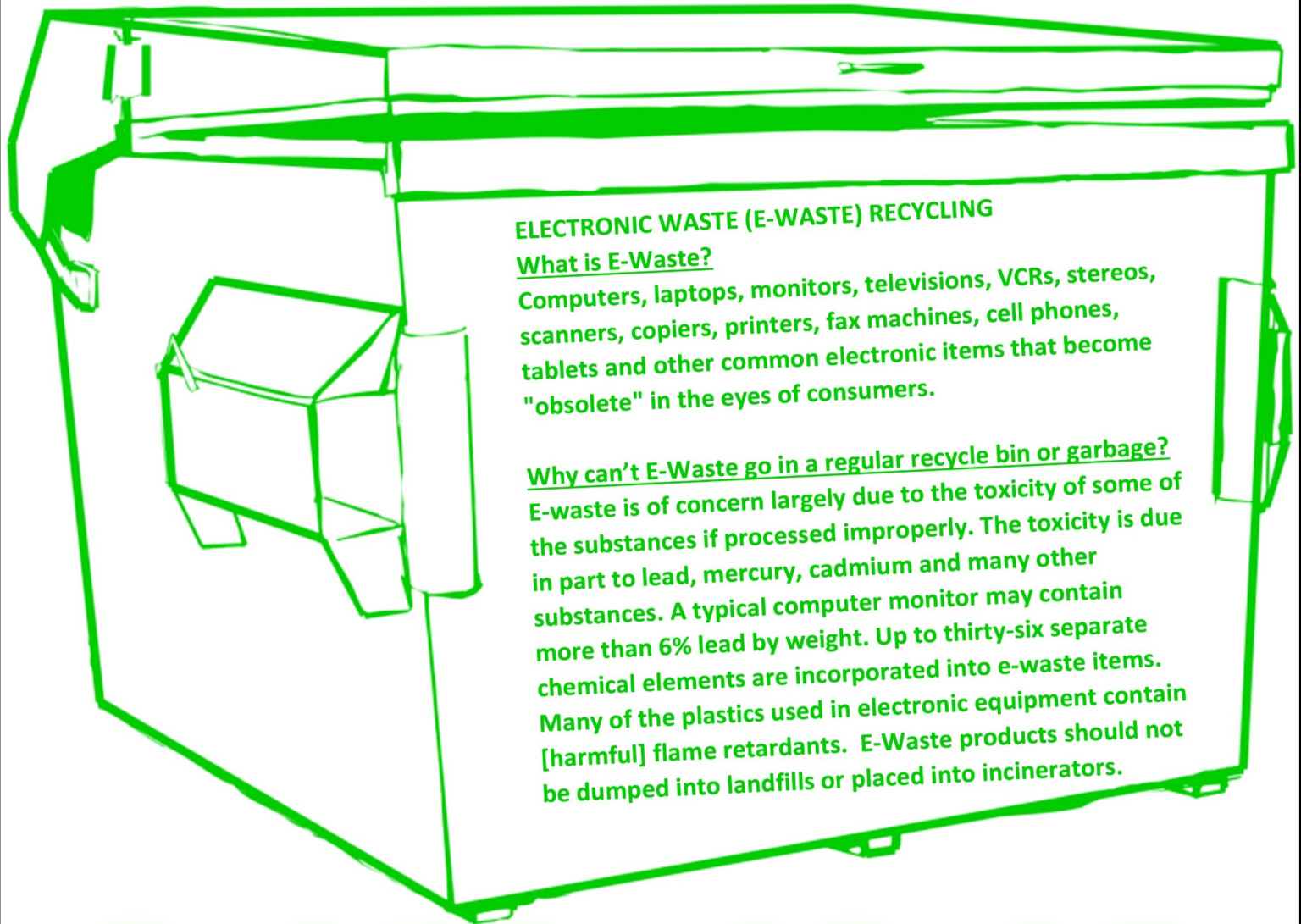

ELECTRONIC WASTE (E-WASTE) RECYCLING

What is E-Waste?

Computers, laptops, monitors, televisions, VCRs, stereos, scanners, copiers, printers, fax machines, cell phones, tablets and other common electronic items that become "obsolete" in the eyes of consumers.

Why can't E-Waste go in a regular recycle bin or garbage?

E-waste is of concern largely due to the toxicity of some of the substances if processed improperly. The toxicity is due in part to lead, mercury, cadmium and many other substances. A typical computer monitor may contain more than 6% lead by weight. Up to thirty-six separate chemical elements are incorporated into e-waste items. Many of the plastics used in electronic equipment contain [harmful] flame retardants. E-Waste products should not be dumped into landfills or placed into incinerators.
